

Mobile Unit Driver

The Mobile Unit Driver will help to pick up the mobile unit from the secured parking area and pick up the day's staff from the designated meeting site. The driver will take the vehicle to the designated location for the day, manage any logs and mobile maintenance as needed. Mobile Unit Drivers are also encouraged to be available as a Men's Advocate for any (soon to be) dads that might come to the Mobile Unit with their girlfriend/spouse.

Time Commitment: 1 shift per week

Qualifications:

- 1. Be a committed Christian who demonstrates a personal relationship with Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord.
- 2. Exhibit strong commitment and dedication to the biblical teachings of the sanctity of life, sanctity of marriage.
- 3. Agree with and be willing to uphold the Ministerial Statements and policies of the organization.
- 4. Exhibits spiritual maturity and the ability to carry the burdens of others.
- 5. Effective interpersonal communication skills, especially oral communications.
- 6. Effective listening skills
- 7. Good organizational skills
- 8. Able to work with computer programs with training provided.
- 9. Heart to serve with compassion putting the woman and her needs first.

Application and Training Requirements:

- 1. Volunteer application, testimony, and background check.
- 2. AACC Pregnancy Coach Training and Certification
- 3. Successful completion of the Center "On-the-Job" Training Plan
- 4. Continuing Education Workshops 4 per year
 - a. Annual Gospel Workshop as required by ministry policy.

Job Requirements:

- 1. Greet clients when they arrive to the bus. Provides emotional support in a pleasant and non-judgmental tone. Maintain a pleasant and courteous voice with clients, offering assistance especially to abortion-vulnerable clients.
- 2. Well trained in educational resources, both in written form (brochure) and media (DVD) available for options education.
- 3. Familiar with referral guides and books and able to efficiently give information to clients. Provide education and referrals related to adoption, post-abortion healing, social services, and other areas of need.
- 4. Provide education and guidance in the areas of abstinence, secondary virginity, contraception, and STDs, as well as in the areas of fetal development and abortion.
- 5. Continues follow up with client for as long as the client permits.
- 6. Helps the mobile unit team with client scheduling and client file/paperwork
- 7. Pray with clients and discuss their spiritual relationships, encouraging them to seek an active relationship with Jesus Christ.
- 8. Assists the client with ongoing appointments in medical services if not available same day; i.e.: ultrasound or STI Clinic
- 9. Provides Parenting Introduction as appropriate for client's need.
